Art Classes with Ryan Brearley **More Drawing...**

This class will introduce basic drawing concepts as well as build on skills already gained in earlier classes. Revisiting exercises helps reinforce the concepts and we will begin to use these skills in approaching different kinds of subject matter, for example the landscape and portraits. This class will suit beginners and intermediates.

Mondays 9.30am to 12.30pm, February 4th and 18th, March 4th and 18th Cost: \$100

Introduction to Printmaking

This four-week class will introduce participants to two of the basic printmaking techniques, intaglio and relief. You will explore mark making in both methods and see appropriateness to certain subject matters.

Mondays 9:30am to 12:30pm, February 11th, 25th, March 25th and April 1st Cost: \$100

Painting – seeing colour and applying it in your work.

This term we will explore a series of exercises that fine tune your perception of colour. The exercises will help you apply the theories into your work, and paint more confidently with colour. Suitable for oils and acrylics.

Cost: \$225/\$430

Beginning to see and draw

This class introduces participants to the concepts and ideas to enable them to draw what they see. Drawing in the mass using tone and edge allows people who think they can't draw that they can! Participants will be exposed to concepts of blind contour,

gesture, as well as the Golden section and perspective. Critical appraisal of your work will be made by the tutor and peers at the end of each class. Materials needed will be discussed during the first lesson.
Thursdays and Fridays 9.30am to 12.30pm from February 7th/8th for 9 weeks Cost: \$225

Drawings to prints

This class will take your drawings and turn them into prints! Using different techniques learnt in *Introduction to Printmaking*. You will develop your prints into stand-alone pieces of art. There will be a materials cost worked out in the first class. Participants will need to have completed previous print making classes with Ryan.
Thursdays 1:30pm to 4:30pm from February 7th for 9 weeks. Cost: \$225

Introduction to Design in Art

This class will introduce the elements and principles of design. We will break down how to identify each element and principle and learn how they work together to create harmony or discord in the fine arts. The class will culminate in a project using the concepts learnt.
Fridays 1:30pm to 4:30pm from February 8th for 9 weeks Cost: \$225

Life Drawing Group - untutored

Saturdays, February 2nd to April 6th, 1.00 to 3.15pm. Cost: \$20 per week or \$55 for any 4 sessions, \$75 for any 6, \$90 for 8.
No session on March long weekend.

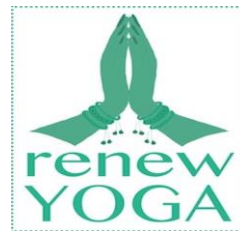
